Entering First-Year Students at Main Campus, Fall 2022 – 4,069

- 49.8% were in top 10% of high school class
- 83.6% were in top 25% of high school class
- 75 valedictorians and 72 salutatorians
- 221% more minority freshmen than in Fall 2012
- Since 1995: 3,233 valedictorians and salutatorians enrolled at all campuses

UConn 2000 CAPITAL PROGRAM

- Since FY96, \$4.0 billion in State GO bonds have been authorized and \$3.6 billion expended

FY22:

- Budget \$271M
- Expenses \$248M
- 79 New projects initiated & 117 projects closed
- 170 active projects with budgets totaling \$1.1B and \$0.8B of expenses

Private Giving Fiscal Year 2022

- In FY 2022, private donations to the University totaled \$115 million. Of that amount, \$29.4 million was donated for scholarships and student support, \$41.5 million for program support, \$24.4 million for research, \$5.9 million for faculty support and \$13.8 million for capital improvements.
- Alumni and students contributed \$44.7 million in FY 2022. Parents and other individuals contributed \$31.9 million. Corporations and organizations added an additional \$38.4 million.
- Funds made available to support the University in FY 2022 totaled \$77.8 million.
- The University endowment portfolio was valued at \$593 million at the fiscal year-end, including more than \$242 million for scholarships.
